CAMMS QUEEN ADELAIDE STAKES LAUNCHES ONTO THE SCENE IN 2012

Black type racing returns to Morphettville Racecourse this Saturday 4 February for the first time in 2012 with the running of the CAMMS Queen Adelaide Stakes.

A Listed race for two year olds over 1050 metres, the CAMMS Queen Adelaide Stakes carries prizemoney of \$80,000, attracting a field of eight runners.

The horse to beat is a visitor from Victoria – Armed For Action – an Exceed And Excel filly trained by Anthony Freedman who has had one start for a very easy win at Mornington.

One runner sure to attract plenty of attention on the day is the Mark Kavanagh trained filly Fast And Loose who disappointed at her only appearance when a short priced elect. The high priced yearling purchase will be out to redeem herself on Saturday, and Kavanagh has made a gear adjustment with the filly applying a tongue tie for this week's race.

Only two newcomers make up the eight runners, with Sheikh Moh Hand debuting for the Leon Macdonald – Andrew Gluyas stable in Adelaide, and David Hayes is sending the well bred Encosta De Lago filly Spice Beauty from his Victorian base to launch her racing career.

The CAMMS Queen Adelaide Stakes is Race Two on the eight race program delivered by the South Australian Jockey Club (SAJC), commencing at 1:30pm.
